## Bay 20 Community Centre Hammersmith & Fulham

Est. in the wake of the 2017 Grenfell Tower fire, Bay 20's founders and volunteers provide free meals and practical advice to the 100s of local residents facing extreme hardship. The operation eventually won a bid for a state-of-the-art café-style community hub, completed in January 2020.



"What we found, even before the pandemic, was how important food is. It's a way of reaching out."

Forced to shut its doors to residents during COVID-19, Bay 20 pivoted to become a meal delivery service, catering for a host of local low-income and vulnerable people. The centre unites a community with a collective experience of loss, trauma, love, and community spirit, all through food and talking support.



Free food from City Harvest means the team can invest more money and resources into the community centre, providing help for all ages: youth to elderly.

## Hornbeam Community Cafe

### Waltham Forest

The Hornbeam Community Café, Walthamstow, is a vibrant space catering for vulnerable people in the local area with hot, plant-based meals and distributing free grocery packs. Each week, City Harvest delivers free, nutritious food makes over 700 meals a week for guests at the Hornbeam Cafe.

The community-led model has allowed people in need to approach the Hornbeam for help and free food throughout its existence, without fear of judgment.

The community café's role has evolved into a hub where the team can signpost users to other vital services within the area, especially those facing other challenges, exacerbated by COVID-19.



"We've seen that people want to be a part of a community and help each other. We really want to encourage that, we think there's beauty in that."
